Approving minutes of previous meeting held on 7th February

Everyone in agreement

Matters arising

- <u>Car parking in Llan village</u> A quote of £2000.00 from Tony Evans for preparing the ground and fixing the bench was presented – further consideration needed. In the meantime it was agreed that the noticeboard by the shop in Llanbrynmair could be moved up to the Llan site
- <u>Request for cycle path around the Community Field</u> The hedge has been planted with thanks to Terry Lambert, Hilary Reed, Elaine Turnbull, Wendy Davies, Fiona Cauley, Arwyn Morgan and Gareth and Josh Reast. A tender from Kevin Jones, Machynlleth was accepted for the grass cutting and line painting. S Reast has written to David Thompson (Powys) to ask for Right of Access
- 3. <u>Public toilets</u> Adam Toye has repaired the ceiling in the mens. S Reast and I Edwards met on the site to discuss the water usage and loss. It was agreed that the mens and ladies should remain closed while the problem continues. E Lewis suggested that Severn Trent put a gadget on the meter for measuring throughput for a period of time. B Jones offered the use of a portaloo in case the water had to be turned off entirely. S Reast has updated PHS in order to save money on waste processing and Hafren Dyfrdwy have put a stop on the account while investigations continue. Tony Evans has said that he would like to stop doing the cleaning at the end of March. S Reast to make enquiries about an alternative cleaner
- 4. <u>Noticeboards</u> The new noticeboard for Bont is now in place and the previous one has been installed in the dry in Llanbrynmair bus shelter
- 5. <u>Defibrillator equipment in the Llanbrynmair area</u> The Talerddig defibrillator needs new pads for £60 a pair and new equipment is needed in Pennant
- 6. <u>Consider new equipment for the Playground</u> The new equipment has been ordered but takes 10 weeks to be built, prepared and delivered. It doesn't need to be paid for until the installation is complete. Bran Dearling has agreed to trim the cherry tree that is hanging over the location of the zip wire for free
- 7. <u>Hedges by Pont Bel</u> G Davies has made contact with the owners of Ty'n Ddol to organise the job
- 8. <u>Concealed entrance, Maes yr Efail</u> B Jones and R Ashton to install metal post for mirror no update

- 9. <u>Station House, Talerddig</u> There was a meeting on the 21st of February with Children's Services. There are a few matters yet to be completed and a further update is expected soon. The first two children will be in residence within the month
- 10. <u>Bins at the bottom of Bryneinty Road</u> A response was received from the Area Manager for Waste suggesting a meeting be held on site
- 11. <u>Lloches bws Dolfach</u> The neighbouring residents are opposing the location of the bus shelter. A vote was held to decide if the Council would support it going ahead: 7 supported, 2 abstained
- 12. <u>Trimming hedge and undergrowth in Bont</u> Josh Reast is struggling to find time to complete the work. Another volunteer in Bont has offered to do it and has the necessary tools and equipment
- 13. <u>Bench in Dolfach</u> It was agreed to ask Tony Evans to get on with the job for £300.00
- 14. <u>Broken shed in the play park</u> Waiting for dry weather to move the shed no update
- 15. <u>Footpath from Dolfach to Llanbrynmair and to the Tafolwern turning</u> It was agreed that this should be dscussed when Russell George AS visits
- 16. <u>Fence around Pump House in Bont</u> S Reast has written to Dwr Cymru and received confirmation that it is on their work schedule
- 17. <u>Problems with the Health Centre</u> S Reast has written to them to complain about communication difficulties for elderly people and about late prescriptions and problems getting appointments. A response was received from Lucy Cockrum, (Practice Manager) inviting Councillors to visit the Health Centre to discuss the matters further. E Davies and S Evans to attend
- 18. <u>Flood water by Pont Green</u> S Reast to report to Powys
- 19. <u>Dog poo</u> Consideration given to producing a leaflet to be sent to residents in the village, asking the school children to design some posters and having a conversation with the PCO
- 20. Openreach leaving tree trimmings on the road S Reast to enquire
- 21. Lack of notices for Hafodwen planning application S Reast to report to Powys
- 22. Path past Ysgoldy in Talerddig needs a gate S Reast to report to Powys
- 23. Overnight stays in the car park S Reast to organise signs

- <u>Cattle grids between Talerddig and Cwmcalch</u> filled with mud. The work on Belan cattlegrid is underway
- <u>Pipe under Ystradfawr road</u> G Mitchell to look into it
- <u>A470 matters</u> S Reast to invite Russel George AS to discuss the following ; 1. The road collapse by Dolgoch and the effect of closing it on the route between Talerddig and Bont whilst work is done. 2. Speed of traffic at the Wynnstay corner. 3. Speed of traffic in Talerddig. 4. Pathway from Dolfach to Llanbrynmair and on to Tafolwern
- E Davies and G Mitchell went on a tour of inspection to discuss the following issues:
